Hopefully butterfly numbers will have picked up by then, and after all the rain we have had, there should be lots of wild flowers to enjoy. All the summer visiting birds will still be here, many still breeding, and what could be more summer-like than watching swallows flying around catching insects to feed themselves and their young.
